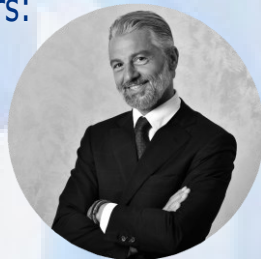

The conference will address the need for think tanks in Italy to provide a forum for the free and open discussion between businesses, social groups, and universities to develop public policy to modernize Italy.

We intend to begin the discussion by examining the role that think tanks play in the United States. Such institutions, which find their origins in a wide range of intellectual perspectives, serve as places for the open critique of social, economic, and political problems and free debate over their reform. American think tanks have become important actors in the conduct of analysis the development of new public policies. They produce work product that goes beyond purely academic books and articles, with an eye toward practical solutions. They depend on charitable contributions like universities, but without a body of alumni who donate out of school loyalties.

This conference will create an open forum to discuss whether the American think tank can take root in Italy. Italy has a related, but different, political, economic, and social context that may call for a different model. But the purpose of the institution will remain the same: to produce high quality research and recommendations to solve difficult public policy challenges. The initiative will be attended by representatives of important US and Italian public policy institutions, together with leaders from academia, culture, consulting, law and business.

An economist by training, he is an empirical scholar whose primary areas of interest include antitrust, securities regulation, corporations law, the economics of crime, employment discrimination, banking and finance, law and economics, and econometric methods. He teaches Antitrust and Trade Regulation; Corporations; and Litigation, Economics, and Statistics, an experiential course focused on Rule 26 Reports in federal litigation.

He has been a visiting professor at Columbia Law in the fall of 2017, and he joined the faculty in 2018 from the University of California, Berkeley, where he taught from 2008 to 2018. He was the founding director of Berkeley's Social Science Data Laboratory, or "D-Lab," a center for innovation in training graduate students regarding quantitative social science generally and emerging big data techniques specifically.

Before teaching at Berkeley, he was an assistant professor at the University of Michigan's Gerald R. Ford School of Public Policy and an assistant professor (courtesy) in Michigan's economics department.

He is also a faculty research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research, where he co-directed the Crime Working Group from 2006 to 2018. In 2011, the University of Chicago Press published his book, *Controlling Crime: Strategies and Tradeoffs* (co-edited with Phil Cook and Jens Ludwig).

He has received grants from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the Arnold Foundation, and the Spencer Foundation.

**She was a member of the Presidential Council of Administrative Justice (2013-2017), and during her office, she was appointed as Vice-President.**

**She possesses a long-standing international experience: in Europe, where she spent a research period abroad: such as in Germany in 1994; in the United States, where since 2015, she has been nominated Visiting Professor at the School of International and Public Affairs of Columbia University, New York City and in 2022 she spent research periods at UC Berkeley School of Law. As a lawyer, she represented several NGOs and individuals before the Italian Constitutional Court, the European Court of Human Rights, and the European Committee of Social Rights. As a Professor of Constitutional Law and Constitutional Justice, she has always investigated issues on constitutional justice, fundamental rights, and their system of protection, especially concerning the most marginalized categories. She is the Author of hundreds of scientific publications in Italian and in English.**

## Nicolò Zanon



Italian jurist and lecturer, he is a judge of the Italian Constitutional Court, where is currently the Vice-President. He is Full professor of Constitutional Law at the Faculty of Law of the University of Milan. In 2017, he was awarded the title of “Cavaliere di Gran Croce dell’Ordine al merito della Repubblica italiana”.

From April 2009 to July 2010, he was a member of the Presidential Council of Administrative Justice. In July 2010 he was elected to the High Council for the Judiciary and held this office until 25 September 2014.

After obtaining a PhD in Comparative Law at the University of Florence, he was researcher at the Faculty of Political Science of the University of Turin between 1991 and 1996. He began his experience as a lecturer at the Bocconi University in Milan, teaching Institutions of Public Law. He then lectured in the Faculty of Political Science at the University of Padua and in the Faculty of Law at both the University of Milan-Bicocca and the University of Milan. He is also the author of scientific articles published in Italian and foreign Law Journals. He has also been a columnist for newspapers such as ‘Il Sole 24 Ore’, ‘Il Giornale’ and ‘Libero’. During his career, he was a member of the ‘Working Group for the Reform of the Regional Statute’, following his appointment by the Director General of the Presidency of the Lombardy Region. For this Region, he has been also a member of the Legislative Committee from 2000 to 2010. He has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Italian Foundation for Cancer Research (FIRC).

She is full professor of Constitutional and Public Comparative Law and a member of the Academic Senate at the University of Milan.

She studied law at the University of Siena before obtaining a *Diploma en Droit Comparé de l'Environnement* in Strasbourg (1979) and a Master of Comparative Law at the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign, USA (1983). She has been a Research Fellow at the Albert Ludwigs University of Freiburg – Germany (1980-1982). From 1984 to 2002 she held several academic positions at the University of Pavia.

Former Member of the Fundamental Rights Agency (FRA) Management Board of the European Union, (Vienna, from 2010 to 2015) and former Member of the Governmental Commission for Institutional reforms (Rome 2013), in 2022 she has been appointed to serve as President of Governmental Commission for Agreements with Religious Confessions (art. 6 of the It. Constitution) .

Author of hundreds of publications, her many scientific interests include issues of the Italian regionalism and of the subsidiarity principle in the different levels of the European multilevel government, the process of European integration in constitutional perspective and the relationship between science and law in fundamental rights decisions, with special attention to those with bioethical features (decisionmaking under scientific and ethical uncertainty).
